In chapter 9, amidst a prophecy of impending destruction, God reminds his people that wisdom will not save them, neither will power or riches. This is true for us as well. No matter how good we think we are in a certain area - how much power or wisdom or resources we have, ultimately what matters is knowing the LORD. We must know his character and actions and follow him. That is why doctrine is so important. That is why we want to careful study and understand God's Word. We want to understand God as he is.
